How much could you raise with £50?

How it works:

Our team at St. Michael's Hospice will send your school £50 for you to use an initial investment to kickstart your fundraising. You can use this money to buy stock for your event, to rent a room or equipment or to get leaflets printed to advertise your event - it's up to you! Then your aim is to raise as much as possible for the Hospice from your event. At the end you'll need to return your £50 investment and anything you raise on top of this will be profit for the Hospice!

Fundraising Goals

We're an independent charity, and only receive 16% statutory funding from the Government. This means we need to raise £15,000 per day to continue providing care to families across North Hampshire. We can only do this with the support of our amazing community.

Here are some fundraising goals to help your pupils see how they can make a big difference:

£26.35 could help fund the cost of a patient's meals, drinks and snacks for one day.

£36.42 could help fund one of our bereavement sessions for family members.

£99.30 could help fund five hours of nursing care for patients in our care.

Every year, our community, including schools like yours, help us provide free, compassionate care for people in North Hampshire who have a life-limiting illness, are facing the end of life, or need bereavement support.

Last year, our community's support helped us to provide the following:



706 complementary therapy sessions were held for patients in our care.



411 bereavement sessions were carried out for the families of our patients.



260 patients were admitted to our In-Patient Unit for care.



349 patients, carers and families attended our Living Well Services.
